No matter what is happening in your situation right now, we are a people of hope in the midst of the world's struggles. Jesus was considered dead forever. He was buried in a tomb in the same way as every dead person had been before him. Yet, God is a God of hope and love, so God gave Jesus life. This same life is for you and for me. Because the tomb is empty, even when we feel that we are heading for certain death, that someone, somewhere might blow us all to

smithereens, we can have peace through our faith that God is with us and nothing can separate us from his love. This is the message of Easter! Jesus is alive! He lives still! We have new life! That life is forever! Rejoice!

# Red Bird Mission Trip

## Facilities Updates

- 1) **Flat Roof Leaking:** We have contracted to get the flat roof fixed that has caused some damage outside of the sanctuary by the Sacristy. The work should begin soon.
- 2) New Code Entry System at Parking Lot Door: Due to security issues, we opted to get a code entry system installed on the parking lot door. This has been installed but as of this letter, the door needs a new part so we are using keys until the part has arrived. If you received a code, it will work when the door is fixed. If you didn't get a code and believe you need one, please contact the office.
- 3) **Stained glass Sanctuary Doors:** The doors at the front of the Sanctuary in the middle have panes that are about to fall out. We are in the process of contacting people to get them fixed. In the meantime, please do not use those doors.


Easter is Sunday, April 20<sup>th</sup>. We will have:

Annual Conference will be held Tuesday, May 20<sup>th</sup> – Thursday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> at Ashore Resort and Beach Club, Ocean City, MD.

# "Rejoice in the Lord: Dwell in Joy!" Is the theme of the 2025 Peninsula-Delaware Conference session. Our guiding Scripture will be from Philippians 4:4-9 (NRSVUE):"

This Conference will be responding to the General Conference in 2024 that proposed some changes to our Book of Discipline and the Structure of the General United Methodist Church. These changes must be voted upon by all Annual Conferences with a majority vote to be enacted.

#### **Proposed Constitutional Amendments 2025**

This year, members of United Methodist annual conferences will vote on four amendments to the denomination's constitution. The amendments deal with regionalization, inclusion in church membership, racism, and clergy-delegate elections.

To be ratified, these amendments need the support of at least two-thirds of all annual conference voters around the globe. The results won't be known or announced until after all 127 United Methodist annual conferences in Africa, Europe, the Philippines and the United States have

voted. The Council of Bishops expects to tally all votes and certify any amendment ratifications at its fall meeting in early November.

A draft of the amendments can be found online. (go to the Pen-del.org website and click on 2025 Annual Conference for the links) The amendments address:

- Carrying out the restructuring plan called "regionalization,"
- Expanding inclusiveness in church membership,
- Standing against racism and colonialism, and
- Clarifying who can vote for clergy delegates.

What we're hoping for is to get out into our community and make Asbury known for our acts of love. The next step is to have people go to community groups and ask questions about the needs of the community.
